Events

GRAI holds information stalls at a range of events including LGBTI events, seniors expos and general community events. Stalls allow us to inform people about GRAI's services and reach older LGBTI people around Perth and WA.

Our events program is particularly busy in November during Seniors Week and PrideFEST



Projects & Skilled Volunteering

Short term and project-based volunteering is also available from time to time and have included:

- graphic design support
- facilitating art/craft sessions
- facilitating information sessions
- interviewing older LGBTI people to gather life stories for publication.



Rainbow Visiting

The Rainbow Visiting program matches volunteers to visit older LGBTI people. Visits take place weekly or fortnightly and can be in a recipient's home, in residential aged care or out in the community.

All our service recipients are LGBTI and aged 50+.

Volunteers are matched with a service recipient based on location, identity and shared interests. Every match is different and can include

- conversation and shared life stories
- shared activities
- going out for a cuppa or to community events

If the match doesn't work for you, you can request to be matched with a different recipient (and the recipient can ask for a change too) - not everyone will get along and that is fine.

Depending on current referrals, it may take some time to find a suitable volunteer/recipient match. You can choose to volunteer in other roles in the meantime, or just stay on our waiting list.

The Rainbow Visiting Coordinator is available to support you and your service recipient.

Who can Volunteer?

Anyone who is LGBTI or an LGBTI ally can volunteer with GRAI.

Some roles require volunteers to be a peer of the recipient/client group so may only be available to people who identify as LGBTI and/or are aged 50+.

All volunteers are required to attend an information session (flexible times/formats available), complete a police check (GRAI can organise this), and sign a volunteer agreement

Additional training and screening checks are required for some roles, like volunteer visiting.

The Aged Care Act 2024 emphasises the importance of fair, inclusive and non-discriminatory treatment for older people, including LGBTI older people. However, after a lifetime of homophobic discrimination, many LGBTI people continue hiding their identity for fear of persecution or poor service.

A lack of affirming environment in the aged care sector and in the community can drive LGBTI people 'back into the closet'. This can have serious health effects, contributing to minority stress and reluctance to access essential services. LGBTI older people are also less likely to have family support, which further increases their risk of social isolation.
